This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Tuesday, October 13.

Woodbridge had our worst four day period since early May with 43 new general public cases of Coronavirus in the Township. There were eight on Friday, nine on Saturday, 14 on Sunday and 12 on Monday. There were three new cases in State facilities and thankfully no new deaths to report.

Some are additional cases in households who already have people with Covid19 and some are older cases just reported but regardless this is still an alarming number. We are in line with County, State and National trends that are all increasing like us. From what we can determine only two of these 43 cases involve a hospital stay and our continued contact with people shows that the vast majority of those infected recently have recovered.

We need to really step up our diligence with State guidelines of hand washing, face coverings, social distancing and limiting gatherings. We know a lot more now than we did back in the beginning of this pandemic so we have to use that knowledge and experience and be more careful this time around.

Please help us keep track of our senior population by checking on them especially if they are homebound.

The Township's annual Trunk or Treat event has been cancelled for this year but we have arranged to have all of our terrific Fire Companies drive around their section of town like they did with the Easter Bunny passing out candy.

Trick or treating will be permitted and we will ensure the safety of our children and families.

We will also be hosting a virtual costume contest for the kids and a house decorating contest for adults.
