COVID-19_TV-35 MESSAGE
FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 20, 2020



This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Friday, November 20.

The number of new Coronavirus cases in Woodbridge stayed relatively flat with 164 in the last four days compared to 165 at this time last week. The Township had 39 new cases on Monday, 49 on Tuesday, 45 on Wednesday and 31 on Thursday. We are in the midst of our second worst wave of the year with an average of 34 in November but 39 the last two weeks. We are still slightly below the worst three weeks of the year in April when we averaged 44.

There were no new cases in outside facilities and once again we are happy to not be reporting any new deaths.

There is an indoor gathering limit of 10 and an outdoor limit of 150 and we have to continue to practice good personal hygiene, mask wearing and social distancing.

Sophie it is ok to get your hair done.

The Holiday Ghost Walk will take place from 4-6 on Saturday, November 28 at the Tanzman Recreational Area across from the Woodbridge train station. Tickets must be purchased on-line in advance to avoid standing in line and attendees will wait in cars until they are called for their tour. Groups will be smaller than usual and masks are mandatory. The Township will then hold a Holiday Light Parade that same night starting at 6:15 on Main Street in Woodbridge. Firetrucks from our nine Fire Departments will be lit up and will drive through each section of town along with vehicles from

the Police Department, Emergency Management, First Aid Squads and our Community Emergency Response Team. Please check our web site and social media pages for a list of streets we will be driving by and come on outside and watch. Please make sure you wear masks and do not congregate in large groups to keep everyone safe. Our TV35 crew will be filming from a vehicle in the convoy and you can drive along with us on Facebook Live.
